One fine day in 1977 my old buddy Bob Keeran came by, and announced that we would be joining a rugby team. That sounded like a pretty cool idea, but neither he nor I knew how to play rugby. As it turned out, we weren't alone. The guys that were putting it together were experienced ruggers, Gary Cardiff and Tony Berlino. We met them and a bunch of other guys like us at a bar, and the Desert Rugby Football Club was born — Palm Desert's first rugby team. I learned that first evening my position would be Loose Head Prop Forward. Bob Keeran was going to be the Hooker (ok that sounds bad but his responsibility is to hook the ball with his leg in the scrum towards the backs — a very serious position). We played at COD and at Oleson Field — wherever we could line out a rugby pitch (the field).

The experience was different than American football – there are no pads in rugby. At the end of the game, you would get together with the opposing team, drink beer and sing the most inappropriate songs known to man. We played all over Southern California and attended tournaments in San Diego and at the world's largest rugby tournament, in Santa Barbara. The team was made up of all kinds of guys from all kinds of backgrounds. Dr. Gary Van Galder was by far the oldest guy on the team – he was 43! He knew the game pretty well, and helped show us newbies how to play. There was a guy, "Crazy Ralph", who had played for the Oakland Raiders. His real name was Chip Oliver and he was the original son-in-law character in the unaired pilot of All in the Family. Not sure how he came to be known as "Crazy Ralph".

After three years on the team, I was off to Cal Poly Pomona to school. The team went on for a few more years and moved to the lower valley where they played on the polo fields. After that, I guess it fizzled out.

This summer while the museum is closed, the HSPD Archives is looking for volunteers for all sorts of projects. Some of them can be done at home, while some need to be done at the HSPD.



- Researchers/Writers/Editors Help write history! We need people to write brief stories (1-2 pages) about Palm Desert's people, places and institutions.


